
You will find a model of a One-Page Novel Response before the blank templates. Your 2 One-Page Novel Responses should reflect your best effort, creativity, and imagination.

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Select and read two grade-level appropriate novels/books of your choice.
- 2. Complete a template for each of the two novels/books.
- 3. Use the directions that follow to complete the center rectangle, top, bottom, and sides of template.
- 4. In each of the remaining four boxes, select and complete one of the options below. If you are unable to print the assignment template, you may create and complete your own.
- 5. Reminder: The majority of your grade is based on content, but creative effort also counts. Consult the attached rubric. Your work should be neat, colorful, and thorough.
- 6. Summer reading tasks are due to your English teacher on Friday, September 9, 2022.

#### **Options:**

**Setting & Mood:** Draw one of the settings from the book including as much detail as possible. Surround the drawing with 3 adjectives that describe the mood that the setting helps create.

**Symbolism:** Draw a key symbol from the book and write a sentence in your own words explaining the importance of the symbol

<u>Connecting to the Text:</u> Write the title and artist of a school-appropriate song. Write at least 4 lines of song lyrics that connect to one aspect of the book and a two-sentence explanation of the connection.

<u>Character</u>: Create an image of your character. Around your character, create a word cluster of at least six character traits.

Rating & Review: Create your own rating system and rate the novel. Write a 3-5 sentence review of the novel.

<u>Design a Bumper Sticker</u>: Design a bumper sticker that conveys one of the messages or themes of the novel.

<u>Acrostic Poem:</u> Using the title of the novel, create an acrostic poem using description of or details about the novel.

**Venn Diagram**: Create a Venn diagram to compare & contrast two characters from the book.




